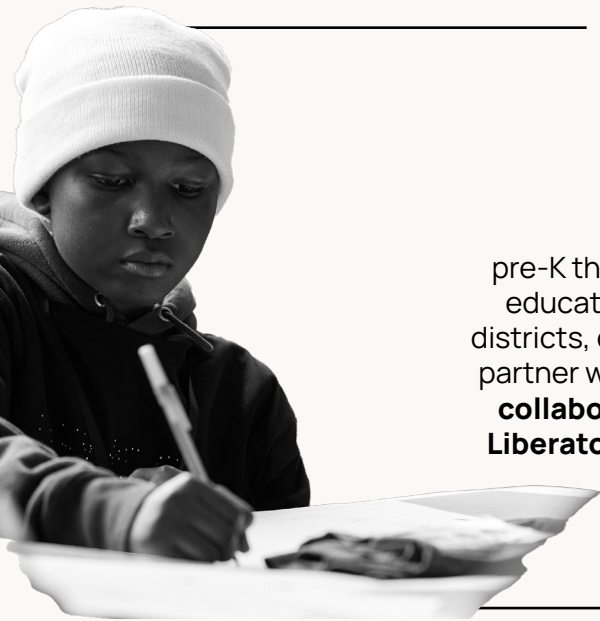
PARTNERING BENEFITS

IMPACT

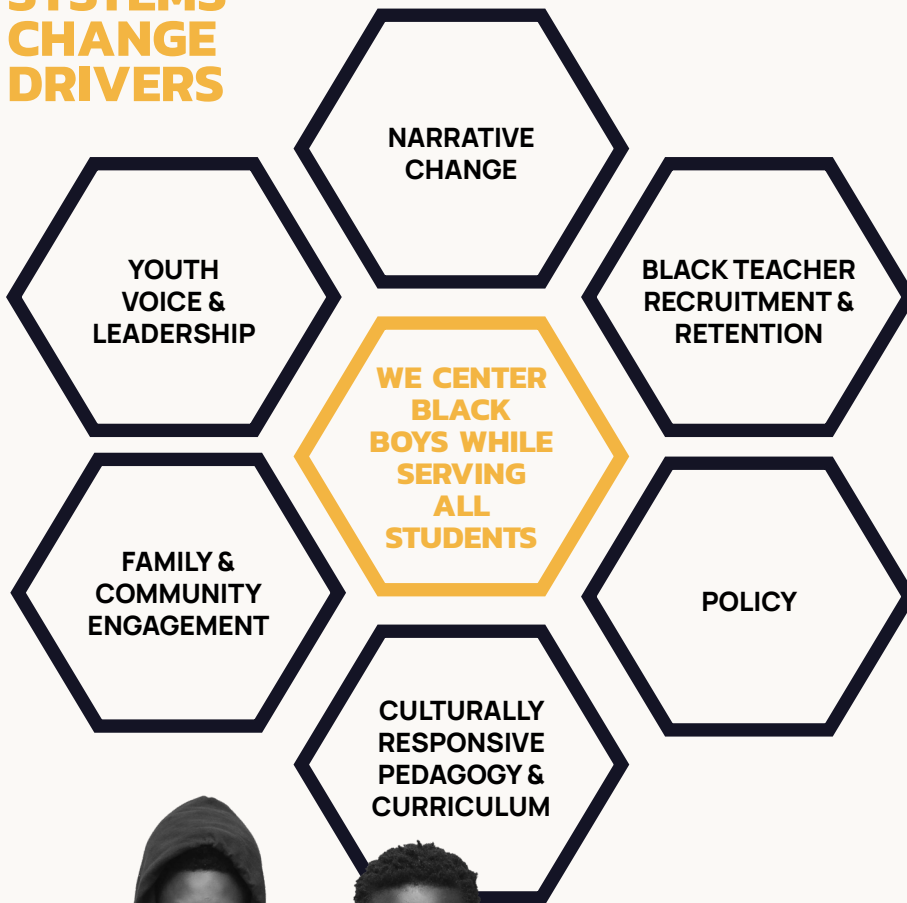
Students experienced Belonging	97% Elementary 90% Secondary
